Full and part subsidies for extra- curricular clubs, visits and music tuition	Increased participation	EEF – Arts and sports participation can be positive. Additionally,' Studies of adventure learning interventions consistently show positive benefits on academic learning. On average, pupils who participate in adventure learning interventions make approximately four additional months' progress. There is also evidence of an impact on noncognitive outcomes such as self-confidence.' Involvement in extra-curricular sporting activities may increase pupil attendance and retention. EEF Toolkit.
